

Soroptimist History



How The Soroptimist Pledge Developed

The search for a Soroptimist "creed" began six months prior to the 1930 biennial convention in Philadelphia, PA, when federation president, Ruby Lee Minar, asked for submissions to be voted on at the convention. While in Philadelphia, the convention delegates chose to defer making a decision for another six months, so that each club could receive copies of the proposed creeds, and then make an informed decision.

Ethel Knight Pollard, then the director of the Midwestern/South Atlantic regions noted, "... we want a creed that we can use and work by and live by, not one that will simply be printed and stuck away to get dusty and have no use to us..."

Six months later, the American Federation of Soroptimist Clubs chose as its creed a pledge that simply stated the ideals of the organization. The pledge was written in 1927 by Candis Nelson, a charter member of the Seattle, WA, club. Candis also wrote other inspirational verses on the spirit of Soroptimist, many of which can be found in early issues of the Soroptimist magazine. The pledge was set to music in 1947 by Dorothy Miller Dunlap, a member of the Hunting Park, CA, club. The setting was adopted as the official musical arrangement of the pledge at the 1950 biennial convention in Seattle, WA—the city of the Soroptimist pledge's birth,

I pledge allegiance to Soroptimism and to the ideals for which it stands:

The Sincerity of Friendship
The Joy of Achievement
The Dignity of Service
The Integrity of Profession
The Love of Country

I will put forth my greatest effort to promote, uphold and defend these ideals, for a larger fellowship in home, in society, in business, for country and for God.

(Note: The pledge was originally written with the word "Soroptimisim". Sometime in the last few years, South Central Region declared there was no such word, so all references to the pledge deleted "Soroptimism" and inserted "Soroptimist".)
