It will be a combination of social time and fund raising for our Foundation.



Cost to play: \$10 for the 1st bingo card, or 3 for \$15.


(We need members to help supply card tables and folding chairs. If you have some you will loan us, please contact Kay for pickup. We would like to have them no later than September 20 for planning purposes)

Also pictured are Kim Ford of Metropolitan Leadership Institute, Inc (and a Lindbergh alumni) who facilitated the donation and Norma McKelvy, SIKC.

Principal Wiley said "Wow this is great. Teachers have already been asking for crayons and I know which classrooms will get some of these supplies."

Lindbergh is located at 641 N 57th St. in Kasnas City, KS. There are 220 students this year of which 87% are minority and

81% are on free lunch. Math and Reading test scores are below the 50th percentile but Lindbergh is listed in the top 20% of most improved schools in Kansas.
